

## Guidelines for Manuscripts

For preparing manuscripts to be submitted to the Journal of Japan Statistical Society, the authors are strongly advised to use the LaTeX style file provided from the home page of the Japan Statistical Society (<http://www.jss.gr.jp/>). Otherwise, the authors should check and follow the following instructions or past papers of the Journal. Note that for preparing the manuscript for review by using the LaTeX style file, you should specify the “draft” mode in the first line of your text.

1. Manuscripts should be typewritten, double-spaced with wide margins.
2. Manuscripts should contain 1) title, 2) names of the authors (marked by \*, \*\*, etc.), 3) summary, 4) body of paper, and 5) references, in this order. Footnote to the title page should contain authors' affiliations and addresses (and e-mail addresses if you want). Furthermore in the footnote indicate running head and keywords of the paper.
3. Example of the title page is as follows:

ESTIMATION AND TESTING HYPOTHESES OF PARAMETERS OF  
MULTIVARIATE NORMAL DISTRIBUTION AND THEIR APPLICATIONS

4. Preparation of references.

Sort the references according to the alphabetical order of the first author's names. For journal papers follow the third example below. For books follow the second example below (italicize and capitalize words in the title of the book). For papers in proceeding follow the first example below.

Anderson, T. W. (1963). Determination of the order of dependence in normally distributed time series, in *Proc. Symp. Time series Anal. Brown. Univ.* (M. Rosenblatt, ed.), John Wiley & Sons, 425-446.

Fisher, R. A. and Yates, F. (1963). *Statistical Tables for Biological, Agricultural and Medical Research* (6th ED.), Oliver and Boyd.

Mann, H. B. and Wald, A.(1943). On the statistical treatment of linear stochastic difference equations, *Econometrica*, **11**, 173-22.

5. Citing a reference.

In the body of the paper, cite a reference with authors and year, for example as

“ Fisher and Yates (1963) ” . To distinguish papers of the same year add a, b, ..., as (1963a), (1963b).

6. Sections are numbered 1., 2., etc. Subsections are numbered 1.1, 1.2, etc. Specific typefaces (italic, bold, etc.) have to be clearly marked.
